

He worked as Vice-Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at the National University of Laos, Deputy-Director General of the Department of Planning and Cooperation of the Ministry of Education, and Secretary General of the Lao National Commission for UNESCO.



Ligia Deca

Education Researcher, State Advisor for Higher Education and Research in the Romanian Presidential Administration

Ligia Deca is the State Advisor for Education and Research at the Presidential Administration in Romania. She is also a doctoral researcher in political science at the University of Luxembourg, focusing on internationalisation of higher education. Previously, she was the Head of the Bologna Process Secretariat (2010-2012), which involved coordinating a team of professionals that supported the activities of the 2009-2012 Bologna Process' work plan and prepared the 2012 Bucharest Ministerial Conference and Third Bologna Policy Forum. She was also the Chairperson of the European Students' Union (ESU) in 2008-2010. In that time, she was the main policy and organisational coordinator of ESU, while being the official ESU representative in the Bologna Follow-Up Group, the European Union setting and UNESCO. In 2012-2013 she worked at the European Register for Quality Assurance for Higher Education (EQAR) and in 2014 she was a member of the European Commission's "Science in Education" Expert Group.

Prof Datuk Dr. Noor Azlan is the tenth Vice-Chancellor of Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), who took up his post in January 2014. 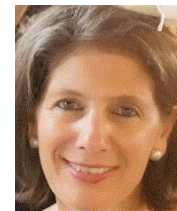

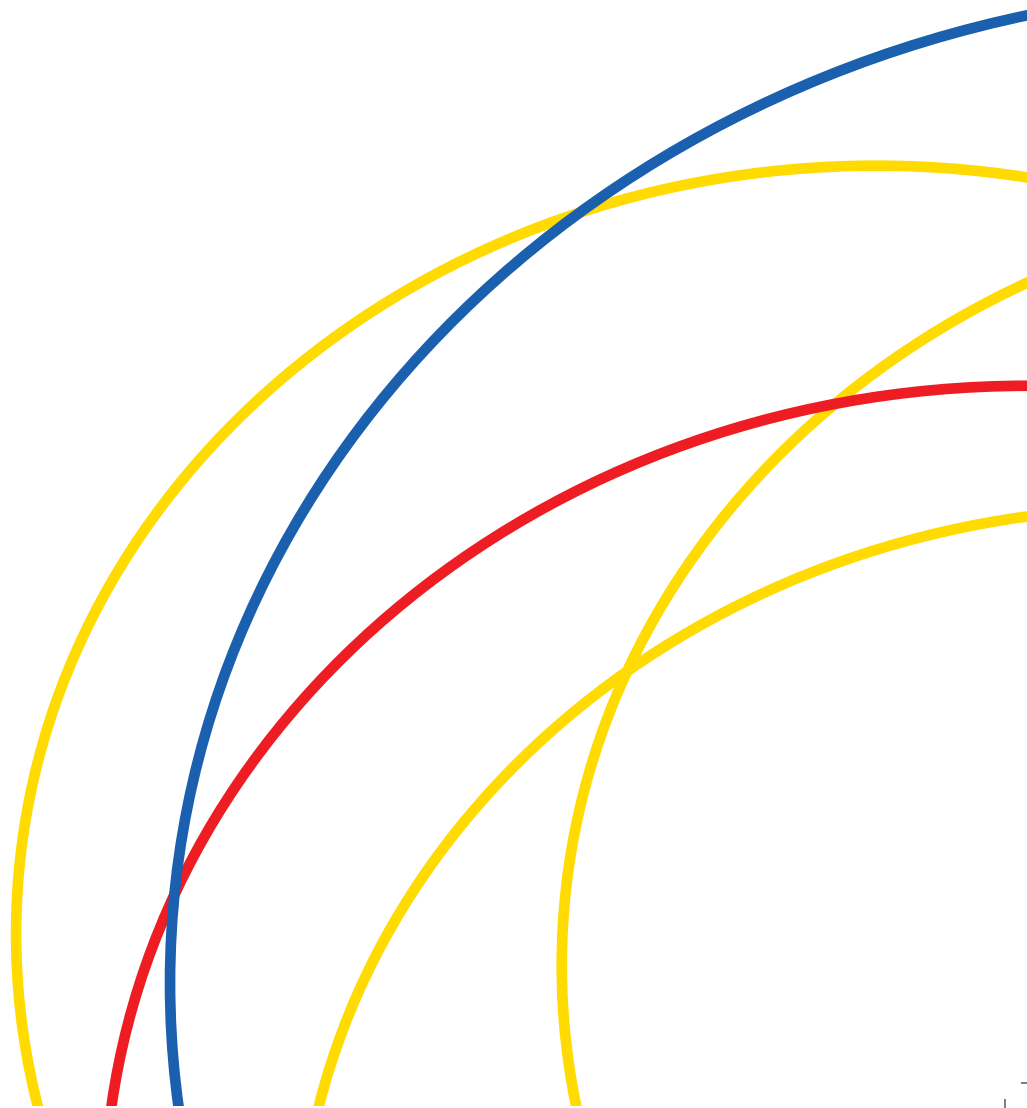
